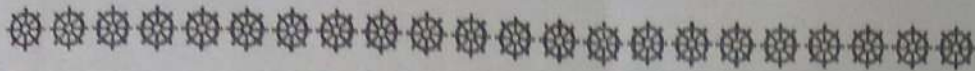

Legal concept of tort elements of liberty (Intention, Motive, carelessness) Kids Liabilities, Absolute, vicarious, fault, statutory).
